The Commission discussed the Chairman's letters to the President of the Racing Associations and agreed to take the matter up personally at a Presidents' Meeting held at 11:00 A. M. today.

RESOLVED, that Westchester Racing Association be and it hereby is authorized to make the following alterations and erections at Belmont Park race course, in accordance with plans and blueprints filed with the Commission, viz:

- 1. To complete the installation of its fire alarm system, connecting all stable stations with the municipal fire station at Elmont, Long Island.
- 2. To erect a new two-story dormitory between stables 12 and 20, for the accommodation of 36 or more employees.
- 3. To alter the old box section at the west end of the grand stand by removing the box railings and rearranging the seats to the end that 418 additional seats for patrons will be provided.
- 4. To reinforce the easterly wall of the club house by the erection of a brick wall to cover the old concrete construction.

On motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

The Chairman reported that he had visited Belmont Park Race Course in company with Mr. George W. Clough, Fire Marshal of Nassau County; that Marshal Clough, the Chairman and Superintendent Boyle, had discussed the question of fire protection at Belmont Park, had examined a number of the barns and acquainted the Fire Marshal with the character of the fire retarding paints which were used in the barns; that the Fire Marshal stated he would make a further examination of Belmont Park and would also confer with the Fire Department of New York City, and that the Commission would have a further report from him.

The Chairman further reported that after communicating with the New York City Fire Department he had received a letter from the Deputy Chief of Staff and Operations, Commanding Divisions of Combustibles and Fire Prevention, which letter stated that an inspection was made of Jamaica Race Course and Aqueduct Race Course on March 13, and that in the opinion of the Deputy Chief the "premises are sufficiently protected".

The Chairman also stated that tests would probably be made of the paints used at Belmont Park to ascertain their fire retarding qualities and that such tests would be participated in by the authorities of New York City and Nassau County.

The Commission discussed the question of adequate water supply at the New York race courses, having in mind the probable shortage of water for City use during the coming season. The Chairman reported that a well was being driven at Jamaica to augment its water supply received from Jamaica Water Company; that Aqueduct had been assured by New York Water Service Corporation that its supply was adequate and that there would be no drawing upon the City's supply for any water which would be used at Aqueduct.

The Commission agreed that the Chairman communicate with Mr. Widener, President of Westchester Racing Association and recommend that Belmont Park provide a well so that Jamaica Water Supply Company, which furnishes water to Belmont Park, might be able to increase its deliveries to the City of New York in the event that such increase should be required.

The question of stall rentals at the New York tracks was considered, and in view of statements made to the Commission to the effect that there were generally many vacancies, particularly in the rented barns and that licensed owners are unable to obtain stalls, the Chairman was authorized to write a letter to the three licensed Associations maintaining tracks in the Metropolitan area, asking that each track designate a representative to discuss the subject of stalls with the Chairman, or a member of the staff of the Commission to be designated by him.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that Section 6 of Article XII of the Rules and Regulations of the Commission, now reading as follows:

"Each Association must in all cases of a pari-mutuel pool distribute not less than \$2.10 on each winning two-dollar wager.",

be smended to read as follows:

"Each Association must in all cases of a pari-mutuel pool distribute not less than \$2.10 on each winning two-dollar wager. No part of any minus pools resulting from such payments shall be charged against the State's participation in the total pools or the breaks."

RESOLVED, that this Commission approve the use by licensed racing associations of the Photofinish Camera and Recording System described in United States Letters Patent 2,482,621.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Commission approved 1:15 P. M., as the post time for the first race for the 1950 Spring Meeting of Westchester Racing Association at Belmont Park Race Course.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Commission approve the proposed amendments to Rules of Racing 69(b) and (c). Rule 69(b) now reading as follows:

"69(b). This registration must be made at the Registry Office within sixty days after the horse's landing in this country, and the registration fee shall be \$5.00 for each horse, which will include certificate of registration"

shall be amended to read as follows:

"69(b). This registration must be made at the Registry Office within sixty days after the horse's original landing in this country, and the registration fee shall be \$10.00 for each horse, which will include certificate of registration."

Rule 69(c) now reading as follows:

"69(c) If it be proved to the satisfaction of the Stewards of The Jockey Club that failure of registration be unintentional or accidental, and provided that application to register be made within one year of arrival in this country, such registration may be permitted by the payment of \$25.00 if made within six months after landing, and if made after such time, upon payment of \$50.00."

If it be proved to the satisfaction of the Stewards of The Jockey Club that failure of registration be unintentional or accidental, and provided that application to register be made within one year of the original arrival in this country, such registration may be permitted by the payment of \$50.00 if made within six months after landing, and if made after such time, upon payment of \$100.00."

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Commission approve the proposed amendment to the National Steeplechase and Hunt Rule of Racing 160 (b), now reading as follows:

"160 (b). A horse shall not be qualified to run in a race with more than five pounds overweight, except when ridden by an Amateur Rider."

so that the same shall read as follows:

"160 (b). A horse shall not be qualified to run in a race with more than five pounds overweight, except when ridden by an Amateur Rider at meetings sanctioned by the Hunts Committee."

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, that the application of The Adjacent Hunts Racing Association, Inc., dated April 11, 1950, for a license to conduct a race meeting on the premises of the Blind Brook Turf and Polo Club in the Town of Harrison, Westchester County, New York, on Saturday, May 27, 1950, which date has been assigned by the National Steeplechase and Hunt Association, be and the same hereby is approved, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman be and he hereby is authorized and directed to issue a license in due form for the holding of said meeting and for pari-mutuel betting thereat, as provided by law, upon said The Adjacent Hunts Racing Association, Inc., paying the statutory fee therefor in the amount of \$25.00; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that said The Adjacent Hunts Racing Association, Inc., shall not be required to maintain and operate the equipment required by Section 6 of the Pari-Mutuel Revenue Law, provided said organization furnishes other equipment and facilities to conduct such pari-mutuel betting and compute the pari-mutuel pools, to the satisfaction of this Commission and the State Tax Commission.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the supervisory fee for the one-day meeting of The Adjacent Hunts Racing Association, Inc., on May 27, 1950, be and the same hereby is fixed, pursuant to Section 25 of Chapter 254 of the Laws of 1940 (Unconsolidated Laws, Section 7583) at the sum of \$35.00.

Upon motion duly made and seconded, the Commission designated Mr. Robert B. Young, as the official Steward of the New York State Racing Commission for the Hunt Meeting to be held by The Adjacent Hunts Racing Association, Inc., on May 27, 1950, on the premises of the Blind Brook Turf and Polo Club in the town of Harrison, Westchester County, N. Y., such services to be without compensation or expense.

# "ARTICLE XI - New Section 4

### 1. Photo-Finish Pictures

(a) A photo-finish picture shall be taken of all races at every licensed race course and the use of all negatives, pictures,

equipment and methods shall be subject to the approval of the Commission.

- (b) The Racing Commission shall maintain and have on file a permanent photographic negative and two prints therefrom of each race of which a photo-finish picture has been taken.

- (d) All negatives and prints of the photo-finishes of races shall be retained in the files of the Commission for a period not exceeding three years; and at the end of such time the said negatives and prints shall be destroyed.

(b) After an Amateur rider has ridden six races in any one year, either steeplechase or flat. under recognized rules in any country, he may be called on to appear before the Stewards of the National Steeplechase and Hunt Association to determine his eligibility to continue to ride as an Amateur rider, and the Stewards may ask a rider to appear before them again at any future time.

"Ridden for Hire".--Professional Hunt Servants, grooms, apprentices, stable lads, and persons who are or have been employed with pay in any capacity in private, hunting racing, showing, livery, or horsedealers' stables, also persons who have ever received payment, directly or indirectly, for riding are regarded as having "ridden for hire", and are professional riders for the purposes of these Rules.

Except as otherwise in this rule provided, no person, being upon the premises of a licensed racing corporation, shall transmit therefrom by telephone, telegraph, teletype, semaphore, signal device, radio, television or other method or means of electrical, mechanical, manual or visual communication, the result of any race, or any information whatsoever with respect to the odds or the wagering pools; or any information dealing with track conditions, jockey changes, changes of equipment, scratches, or any other information whatsoever relating to a race, provided, however, that corporations licensed by the Commission to conduct race meetings may permit radio broadcasts and video telecasts of racing programs upon the written approval of the Commission; and upon such terms as the Commission may impose in such approval; and further provided that such licensed corporations may permit representatives of the public press to send, for the exclusive use of such press, news items, "scratches" and changes of jockeys and equipment, and also the results of each race after the same has been declared "official" together with the amounts of the final pools and the pay-off prices of such races; and such licensed corporations may permit telephone, telegraph and teletype wires and equipment on their respective premises during race meetings for the use of such representatives of the public press and for the transaction of the ordinary business of such licensed corporation, the Commission and the State Tax Commission; but no message shall be sent in or out of said licensed corporation's premises by any communication device or means transmitting money or other thing of value or directing the placing of any wager on the result of a race; nor shall any such message be sent in cipher or code nor unless the same be in plain and intelligible English.
- Section 2. Each licensed racing association shall post in a prominent place close to every form of communication device herein mentioned, such warning notice with respect to the use thereof, in accordance with this rule, as the Commission may prescribe.
- Section 3. Each licensed racing association shall, upon request from the Commission, furnish the Commission with a written description or blue print, as requested by the Commission, showing the location of all equipment used or permitted to be used for the transmission of information within, to or from its premises, together with all telephone, teletype and telegraph or other electrical wires, and radio and television equipment upon or entering its premises.

Section 4. Each licensed racing association shall furnish to the Commission a full and complete copy of each and every proposed agreement for radio broadcast or video telecast of any part of the program or any other incident at their respective race courses during the racing season, at least ten days prior to the execution of any such agreement by such racing association.
