## MOHEGAN SUN AT THE CONCORD

d. Submit as <u>Exhibit VIII. C.6.d.</u> a description of the attributes of the slot accounting system that is planned for Applicant's operation, which allows the Gaming Commission access for the purposes of auditing revenues and game status.

We will supply the Commission and on site law enforcement personnel access to the surveillance CCTV camera system in their office areas or viewing room(s) as directed by the Commission and New York State Police authorities. Such coverage will include, as determined by the Commission:

- Detention areas
- Finger Printing areas as deemed necessary by the New York State Police and the Comission
- Camera coverage of activities on and off the casino floor

Although the control of cameras is most typically left with the Surveillance Department personnel in order to eliminate or minimize the potential for contradictory controls, we have the ability at Mohegan Sun at Concord to provide control to designated regulatory personnel and will defer to the New York State Police and the Commission to determine the level of control to be available to the regulatory team. In Pennsylvania, for example, the regulatory team has a control panel that has the same control features provided to the surveillance team. In addition, the regulatory team can override the controls to any and all cameras.

At MSC, we will use a state-of-the-art casino data system which includes the ability to monitor all carded play by account. We will provide monitoring terminals to the Commission staff, as directed by the Commission. As the system is large and complex, we will provide training to the regulatory team to access and move throughout the casino data system in a proficient and effective manner. Our staff at MSC will work to ensure that all tools necessary to conduct audits of our activities are available and transparent to the Commission staff – through systems, paperwork, and processes.
