


Submit as Exhibit X.C.5. a description of plans for water efficiency and conservation at the Gaming Facility including, without limitation, plans to use low-flow water fixtures, water efficient appliances, and implement water conservation at the Gaming Facility.

Adelaar and Montreign Resort Casino have plans to implement practices and technologies that ultimately reduce consumptive use of water throughout the property.

Water conservation will be achieved within the facilities based on plumbing fixture design and selection, including the use of one pint urinals, low flow water closets and shower heads, metered and timed faucets and high performance ice machines and kitchen equipment. Implementation of sustainable practices include linen reuse programs, water conservation while cleaning, food thawing procedures and policies such as filling dishwashers to capacity prior to start-up.

Low-flow shower heads and toilets will be installed in hotel rooms and, based on the linen reuse program, guests are offered the option (and even encouraged) to reuse towels, linens and bed sheets each day.

Montreign has directed the design team to move away from water-intensive uses normally found in these types of properties, including the exclusion







of water features and fountains on property, and limiting their use indoors. Also, Montreign has directed the design team to implement practices and technologies that ultimately reduce consumptive use, including strict water restrictions for irrigation on landscaping, such as the use of drip irrigation. Other opportunities designated include the use of variable speed drives on swimming pools and water pumps for any water features.

The proposed Indoor Waterpark Lodge plans to makes use of water amenities that are equipped with high efficiency sand filtration systems that recycle and purify the water so it can be reused and not wasted. The latest equipment designed for these facilities is far more efficient than it was even five (5) years ago.
