

## Exhibit X.A.5 - Treatment and Prevention

Submit as Exhibit X.A.5. a description of plans to coordinate with local providers to facilitate assistance and treatment for those with gambling-related problems and plans to develop prevention programs targeted toward vulnerable populations.

Tioga Downs has an existing relationship with TCCASA (Tioga County Council on Addiction and Substance Abuse) which helps to facilitate local education and treatment options. Additionally, there are three active Gamblers Anonymous meetings within proximity to Tioga Downs.

Given our location in a less populated area of New York, those individuals with gambling addictions have may have to travel further to access treatment options compared to those residing in metropolitan regions. In order to build capacity in the Southern Tier among clinicians, pending receipt of a casino license, Tioga Downs will create a grant or scholarship to provide access to training and certifications. This will open a pathway for at least two additional counselors to be certified as a CASAC (Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor) with a specialty in gambling (New York Certified Gambling Certificate) or the National Council on Problem Gaming certification process, Nationally Certified Gambling Counselor I &II, with a primary practice area within a one hour drive of Tioga Downs. Tioga



Downs will solicit applications of interest from area therapists, with a goal of certification within one year of the award of the casino license.

Tioga Downs expects to partner with TCCASA, NYCPG and the NY Gaming Commission to identify opportunities to develop and implement prevention programs targeting vulnerable populations. We envision opportunities such as providing for a "Speakers Series" to create outreach and programming to reach and educate diverse audiences such as:
